



Pastor's Reflection - 10 Year Anniversary



This July, I will celebrate my 10-year anniversary as serving as the Pastor of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church. That is approximately 500 Sundays, 625 sermons and one incredible family that continues to support me through it all. Over the past several weeks I have been reflecting on my 10 years of active ministry here and boy are there a lot of things that stand out and deserve some reflection. Here are 10 things to think about, one for each year.

1. Jesus is the reason. My name and getting national attention for being the "Pot Pastor" is not the point. The church and its attention are not the point. I never want people to walk away from a sermon or worship service impressed with anyone or anything...rather I want the focus to be on Jesus. Jesus is the reason for all that we do and say. We don't say this enough and it deserves to be the first point. Too often, in our celebrity church culture, we celebrate certain pastors and lift some churches above the rest, more than we celebrate Jesus and His amazing grace.

2. Watching God transform lives never gets old. Pastoral ministry is hard work but one of the greatest joys I have experienced over the past 10 years is watching God work in people's lives. With the Touch of Grace I have seen lives liberating from darkness into light. To date, I have baptized 72 beautiful children of God and I have been privileged to so many amazing conversations in my office or in the home, where I have witnessed the power of prayer and God's love take over and transform the life of another. God is moving and it is fun to be a part of what God is doing!

3. It is easy to get busy and lose sight of what's important. In my ordination vows I declared that I would be diligent in my study of the holy scriptures and faithful in my use of the means of grace. That I would pray for God's people, and nourish them with the word and sacraments, and lead them by my own example in faithful service and holy living. There are numerous demands on a pastor's time and many of these demands are good, but we also struggle to remember what is important. Each year I have vowed to pull out my ordination vows and remember my responsibilities that you have all entrusted me with.

4. You can never pray too much. This is as simple as it comes. Prayer needs to be one of the most important aspects of my life and ministry. Over the past year I have sharpened my prayer life by meeting monthly with a spiritual director. I feel more alive than ever and my relationship with Christ is strong and well.

5. My primary ministry is to my own family. It is easy for pastors to sacrifice their family for the work of the church. Evening meetings, late night calls, a funeral scheduled for a busy weekend. There are numerous demands. There are always more sermons to write and more people to visit. However, before St. John's called me into ministry, Rachel and Andrew were already a priority and my family will always be that way. Thank you for allowing me to devote my life to my family...it is a work in progress, but it truly is a joy to see our kids love the church.

6. God gave you two ears and one mouth. We need to learn to listen to each other. Intentional listening is an artform, one of the gifts I admire in my wife the most. Some of the greatest moments in ministry thus far have not been about my sharing but listening to the gospel come from your lips. Don't be afraid to sit and listen, sometimes even silence can guide the conversation. This is something I am still working on and it is always helpful to reflect on how one uses their ears above the mouth in conversation and relationship building.

7. Rest and exercise are essential. This has been something that I have grown to learn over the past two years. I have witnessed too many friends struggling with weight gain or depression. The truth is that I need a good amount of sleep, eat the right things and stay active each day to be at my best. You may notice a watch around my wrist, even in worship, which is a little crazy for me. But my goal is to fill every single day with enough activity that I can continue doing this work well into my 80's. The watch helps me keep track, at least this is how I am justifying this technology purchase.

8. Synod and Conference meetings are essential. This may sound crazy, but I have thoroughly enjoyed working and collaborating with other pastors. We can't even come close to the work the wider church does on our behalf. It is essential to stay in relationship with congregations in our area and continue to find ways to work together. Just think about all the incredible ministries we claim together; for example: the food pantry, Good News and Brews, Confirmation Camp, hosting a seminarian and so much more.

9. Patience is key. I am not a very patient person (this is one of the fruits of the Spirit that God is consistently cultivating within me!) Being a pastor is an exercise in patience. I want to see God do things immediately but that is not how it always works. I have had to learn patience and sometimes delegate to someone else. And, maybe the thing I created doesn't grow the way I conceived it, but this is ok. I am extremely thankful for our dedicated leaders, council members and church staff who have walked with me through this learning experience and stepped up in so many ways over the years.

10. Be a constant learner. Finally, one of the greatest benefits I derived from seminary was the discipline of being a lifelong learner. This has helped me tremendously over the past 10 years as I continue to grow into who God is calling me to be as pastor. The Chautauqua Leadership Academy was an incredible opportunity. The Bishop's convocation and preaching selective at the seminary have been a constant blessing. In the coming year I look to fine tune my skills in my chaplaincy to the fire department by taking courses in Critical Incident Stress Management. As a pastor, I need to make sure that I am constantly growing. We should minister out of the overflow of what God is doing in us and through us.

Thank you all for your support and continued love of the ministry we share at St. John's. It is amazing to look back at 10 years and think about all the things that God has done with us and through us. I pray the Holy Spirit continues to point us to continued growth and shared ministry. I, of course, owe a lot of my success to each and every one of you. Thank you for all that you do to make St. John's a wonderful place to worship and share the word and sacrament of Jesus Christ.

ST. JOHN'S HAPPENINGS

WINDOW REFURBISHMENT PROJECT 2019

Most of us have viewed the beauty of the sun shining through our stained-glass windows during a Sunday morning church service. The amazing colors displayed through these windows provides a glimpse into the splendor of the heavens and can have a significant emotional impact on us as we worship and marvel at God's work in our world. Thanks to the generosity of donors when our existing church building was rebuilt after a fire in 1889, we enjoy the wonderment of their beauty today.

But have you viewed these windows from outside of the sanctuary? Take a close look and you will see peeling paint, cracked and/or missing glazing and in some, deterioration of the wood framing. In fact, if you look even closer, you'll notice some do not close entirely. And it's not just the sanctuary windows, it's the church and education building windows too.

The good news is this deterioration can be remedied! By removing the old storm windows; cleaning, scraping, re-glazing, painting and installing new "breathable" storm windows, the windows can be restored. Of course, this comes with a cost. We've worked with a contractor who has already refurbished a few of our windows, second floor elevator landing and the west entry foyer. Take a look to see the difference! As you know, this comes with a cost which could be as high as \$100,000; certainly a hefty price but considering the alternative - losing our beautiful stained glass windows - well worth it.

So, how do we pay for this? St. John's Window Refurbishment Project Committee will seek *Window Sponsors* to support this effort. Individuals or families who would be interested in sponsoring a window in honor of, or in memory of loved ones, or to the Glory of God. Rededication plaques would be placed on each window recognizing the individual or family sponsor. Any monies raised in excess of the project costs would be used to support additional improvements to the interior of our sanctuary (paint, carpet, textiles, sound, A/V and lighting) in the years to come. This would be Phase II of our overall Sanctuary Refurbishment Project.

In the coming months, the Window Refurbishment Committee working on this project will provide more information and details on how you can support this very important effort.
